

R E S O L U T I O N


as it is a fact that good and friendly relations between countries are of utmost importance, and as the consular system has proved to be a very successful and economical way for the sending state to arrange that its interests are well looked after in the receiving state, solely or in addition to the diplomatic representation set up in the receiving state, the consular associations of Denmark, Finland, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Norway and Sweden have founded the association called "Federation internationale des Corps Consulaires et Associations Consulaires", which has unanimously adopted the following resolution subject to approval by the respective boards.

1. It is our aim as an international association to assist the national consular corps and associations subject to the existing protocol of the receiving states in order to:
 - a) - attain a uniform treatment of the individual consuls in the receiving states,
 - b) - improve and enlarge the facilities, privileges, prerogatives and immunities of the individual consul in the receiving state according to the principle of reciprocity,
 - c) - support the consular corps and associations in the receiving states in their efforts to provide the sufficient protection and security of the consul whenever and wherever necessary,

- d) - promote and study cultural and social works in order to better meet our objective in general and to contribute to any such activity relating to our work as consuls,
- e) - be represented at committees under the auspices of the United Nations established for the purpose of altering, amending the Vienna Convention of 1963 or at any other committee dealing with the facilities, privileges and immunities of the consul,


giving better opportunities in fulfilling their obligations as to facilities, privileges, immunities in the receiving states according to the Vienna Convention of 1963.
